

Binghamton University's Decker College of Nursing graduate program is seeking Family Nurse Practitioner or Adult Gerontology Primary Care NP student applicants for the Health Resources and Services Administration (HRSA) Advanced Nurse Education Workforce (ANEW) Federal Workforce training grant. We are still accepting applications for our Fall 2021 cohort and welcome eligible candidates to apply. Eligibility requires full-time enrollment, living in a rural county, and an interest in caring for rural and vulnerable populations. Applicants must submit an application and be accepted for the Fall 2021 entry term in the Family Nurse Practitioner or Adult Gerontology Primary Care NP program of study. Interested candidates [must first apply](#) to Binghamton University Graduate school in order to be considered for the HRSA traineeship grant program.

If you receive notification from Binghamton University Graduate school that you have been accepted into a Masters program of study, the next step is to pay your deposit. After we receive your deposit you may be considered eligible for this funding opportunity.

I encourage you to also take a look at our website for some additional information. As part of the HRSA grant, the [Rural Telehealth Education Consortium \(RTEC\)](#) was created to establish and build a networking partnership, which now consists of over 40 organizations throughout New York State that are currently implementing or developing telehealth programs and services. This is also another way we are able to establish preceptor relationships so our students can complete their education and lay the foundation for potential employment after graduation.

Interested candidates must submit the following to Jo Anne Potter at jmpotter@binghamton.edu that will describe the following:

- Why you want to work in rural, underserved or primary care
- Identify your geographic location with RUCC and RUCA Code
- Describe your goals after graduation
- This letter must be on a Microsoft Word Document which contains your **last name and your B# in the file name**
