Farmers' Market Resiliency Grant Program



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The Department invites eligible applicants to apply for funding through the the \$1,000,000 Farmers' Market Resiliency Grant Program.

The program aims to provide the opportunity to build long-term food system resiliency through New York State's Farmers' Markets.

Funding will be available for projects that will help enhance current food system resiliency through farmers' markets, including projects aimed at the development and enhancement of farmers' market infrastructure, online infrastructure, marketing and outreach efforts, and/or delivery capabilities across the state.

Our project, "Building Resiliency Among New York's Rural Health Organizations," will produce a rural mental health needs assessment of New York State's 44 rural counties; NYSARH will then form a collective impact network, convening rural health stakeholders to identify and collaborate on shared priorities as informed by this needs assessment.
